
History of SSAC in ROK



- Joined IAEA in 1957
- 1975 Ratified NPT and signed CSA with IAEA in 1975
- 1997 Establish SSAC in 1997
- 2004 In 2004, after AP entered into force
 - AVLIS ('fail to report' sensitive fuel cycle research)
 - Announce Four Principles of Peaceful Use of Nuclear Energy
- 2006 KINAC was established in 2006
- **2008** Braoder Conclusion was drawn by IAEA in 2008
 - Integrated safeguards implemented from July 1, 2008
- 2009 Integrated safeguards applied to all facilities from 2009

Role of SSAC in ROK-I



- Support IAEA safeguards
- Consideration on the companies possesing small quantity nuclear material
- Hold annual workshop to spread concept of safeguards
 - Mandatory by law from 2006
- Expand Voluntary support to IAEA(to improve verification capability) through MSSP

Role of SSAC in ROK-II




- Cooperation with IAEA
 - SBD for pyro
 - Hold Training courses
 - Co-develop the safegaurds training module
 - Ceritification of the safeguards equipment
 - Preparation for the Enhanced cooperation
