

APSN 7th Plenary Meeting Chair's Summary 19 October 2016 Tokyo, Japan

- The seventh Plenary meeting of the Asia-Pacific Safeguards Network (APSN) was held on 19 October 2016 in Tokyo, hosted by Government of Japan and sponsored by Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Japan (MOFA). The Plenary was attended by 35 representatives from 14 countries, including a representative from the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA).
- 2. APSN's five Working Groups session was held on 18-19 October 2016 in Tokyo prior to the Plenary meeting. A site visit to Rokkasho Reprocessing Plant will be conducted on 20 October.
- 3. The Plenary was chaired by Mr. Kazutoshi Aikawa, APSN Chair and Director General of Disarmament, Non-Proliferation and Science Department, MOFA. He provided welcoming remarks, conveying Japan's strong support for APSN and commitment to high standards of nuclear safeguards. He also expressed his gratitude for all participants and welcomed all observer countries and organizations (Cambodia, Lao PDR and IAEA) for their participation and ongoing support of APSN.
- 4. Thailand gave a presentation on ASEANTOM including a summary from ASEANTOM's recent activities in 2016 and an action plan of ASEANTOM. The 4th Annual Meeting of ASEANTOM is expected to be held in Philippines in 2017. Discussion followed on future interaction with ASEANTOM including, requesting the new chair follow up with ASEANTOM to explore the most effective way for APSN to support ASEANTOM's safeguards objectives.
- 5. APSN members appreciated the national statements provided by countries on their recent safeguards implementation activities. Members shared experiences on inspection activities, Additional Protocol implementation, and cooperation with the IAEA.
- 6. Facilitators of working groups reported to chair an update on WG's activities to date and future plans for the next 12 months (details in the attached a Summary of Action Items).
 - Safeguards Infrastructure, Implementation and Awareness-Raising (WG1):
 Working Group 1 facilitated an information-sharing session amongst APSN
 members and the IAEA on a range of safeguards implementation challenges, This
 included facilitating an IAEA presentation and Q&A on the Safeguards
 Implementation Practices (SIP) guide on provision of information (Service Series
 33), and on recent developments and priorities in IAEA safeguards. The session
 included presentations from Australia, Bangladesh, Japan, Lao PDR, Mongolia
 and Vietnam on one of two topics: interactions between the IAEA, regulator and
 operator; or recent developments in nuclear industry or safeguards
 implementation. The exchange of views and experiences was very productive
 and the participation by the IAEA's Mr. Peter Rance provided an excellent
 opportunity for guidance on a wide range of topics.



Capacity Building (WG2):

Japan provided an updated overview of WG2's Action Item and shared outcomes of a series of surveys according to its analysis and assessment. Malaysia made a presentation on new developments on its programme focused on 3S. Canada presented experience of the inspector's training and qualification program.US provided their recent approaches to capacity building activities. Japan also gave a presentation on an overview of activities of JAEA's Integrated Support Centre(ISCN). These were active discussion and useful exchange of information about capacity building.

• IT support, communications and information (WG3):

The working group facilitator provided an overview on the updated APSN website including contents and members' responsibilities for further facilitating communication among member states and for public. Some ideas to make contents more useful and informative were discussed, among them keeping a current rotation of photos and keeping the calendar updated and populated with ongoing or planned events. The working group facilitator also strongly encouraged all Members to begin submitting material to the APSN website as soon as possible in order to populate the website in the early part of 2017 so members can access information and use the website for information, scheduling and sharing documents and experience. The WG also discussed creating specific "corners" for subgroups to discuss training or other topics of interest to them. An update and report on use of the website over the next year will be reported at the next plenary.

Safeguards legislation (WG4):

Indonesia gave a presentation on safeguards model provisions and shared some challenges on national legal basis and regulations. The session included presentations on an overview on their regulations on safeguards including Additional Protocol (AP) from Cambodia, Myanmar and Thailand.

Physical protection in support of strengthening safeguards (WG5):

ROK gave a presentation on NMAC system and Inspector Training Program. All the member states discussed about the result of the survey and decided to redefine and conduct it again.

- 7. Mr. Aikawa announced that the Republic of Korea has its intention to take over the chairmanship of APSN. All APSN members accepted by acclamation that a Director General of NSSC (Nuclear Safety and Security Commission) will become chair and the Korea Institute of Nuclear Non-Proliferation and Control (KINAC) will serve as the Secretariat for the period of next 2 years commencing at the conclusion of the 7th APSN Plenary Meeting.
- 8. Mr. Sook-Hyeon Kim, Director of NSSC, ROK, undertook to find a date and location for the 8th APSN Annual Meeting in 2017.
